Don't say: "I don't want nothing." **Say**: "I don't want anything."


We use **anything (for things)** and **anyone (for people)** in negative sentences and questions. We use **nothing** and **no one** in positive sentences.

P: Hi John, I'm good just a bit busy, you know. **It's a pity** I couldn't **attend** the meeting yesterday. Did you discuss anything important?

P: Did anyone find any **solution** to the **decrease** of sales?

J: Yes, the marketing manager **came up** with a new marketing strategy.

P: I see. Unfortunately, no one has sent me materials from that meeting. Could you please email me a copy of the **agenda** and the marketing plan?

J: Of course, no problem. Are you going to attend our next meeting?

- P: I'll **try my best** to join you next time.
- J: Fine, see you soon.
