

AMOUNT OF x NUMBER OF

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Don't say: Our company employs a large amount of people. **Say**: Our company employs a large **number** of people.

Both expression refer to **quantity** of something/somebody, the difference lies in what is being quantified:

If it is a **countable** noun, we use the construction **number of**. The noun following of is plural, e.g. A large number of customers were satisfied.

If it is an **uncountable** noun, the structure **amount of** is used, e.g. The amount of help we received was enormous.
