

COMPOUND ADJECTIVES



Compound adjectives are adjectives that consist of two words. They are very often connected by a hypen (-) and the second word has the **-ed** ending. They are often used for describing personal appearance or character.

e.g. cross-eyed, left-handed, well-dressed

*When the adjective contains a number and noun, the number is always in singular, e.g. a fifteen-minute walk, a five-star hotel. When the adjective indicates age, the word "year" is always singular. So we say: He is five years old. BUT a five-year-old boy!
