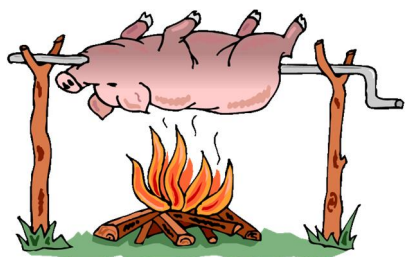
### ALL x WHOLE x EVERY

Below is a table to show when each word is used before a noun.

	Countable Nouns		Uncountable Nouns	Example Sentences
	Singular	Plural		
<b>all</b>		<b>X</b>	<b>X</b>	I finished <b>all</b> the cookies/homework.
<b>whole</b>	<b>X</b>		<b>X</b>	I ate a <b>whole</b> pizza.
<b>every</b>	<b>X</b>			I drink two coffees <b>every</b> day.

\*Notice that **all** is before an article and **whole** is after an article.
