

DINING IN ENGLAND: TOAST X SANDWICH

In England, going to a restaurant and choosing the right meal can be quite tricky. Look at the three pictures and decide for yourself which one is a toast.







A toast is a slice of toasted bread which usually accompanies some main meal, typically part of a breakfast menu or a salad. **A sandwich** consists of two slices of non-toasted toast bread and is usually filled with vegetables and other ingredients, e.g. eggs, ham, or tuna. A sandwich can be toasted (as in the picture in the middle).
