THE NUMBER or A NUMBER

Don't say: A number of clients are increasing.

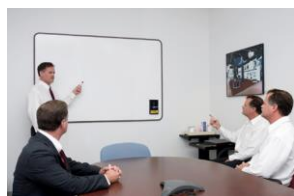
Say: **The number** of clients **is** increasing

Don't say: The number of colleagues is absent today.

Say: **A number** of colleagues **are** absent today.

! When we precede **number** by **the** it denotes a **unit** and is singular. When it's preceded by **a** it means **several** or **many** and is plural.

VOCABULARY BUILDING

= equals – rovná se

x multiplication – násobení: $2 \times 3 = 6$ (two **times/multiplied by** three equals six)

: division – dělení: $12 : 3 = 4$ (twelve **divided by** three equals four)

+ addition – sčítání: $4 + 5 = 9$ (four **plus/and** five equals nine)

- subtraction – odčítání: $3 - 2 = 1$ (three **minus** two equals one)
