DURING x THROUGH

Don't say: "I was traveling through this summer."

Say: "I was traveling during this summer."

During is used with time. We use **through** to talk about place.

TRANSPORT L – Lucy, T – Tim



L: Hi Tim, how was your summer?

T: Hi Lucy. Oh, I really had a great time. I was traveling in Italy during July and August.

L: Sounds fantastic! How did you travel?

T: I am not a fan of **hitchhiking**, so I took a **coach** to Rome. After that I **rented** a scooter to go through the west of Italy.

L: Did you also drive on the **motorway**?

T: Well, sometimes. Mostly I used a **cycle lane** when there was a **traffic jam** at **rush hour**. I had to park my scooter close to the **pedestrian zones** when I wanted to **go sightseeing** in cities.

L: I see. What is the **speed limit** in Italy by the way?

T: 50 km/h in towns and 130 km/h on motorways.

L: OK, that's the same as here.
