

ESTIMATE (n) x ESTIMATE (v)

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At first glance, **estimate (n)** and **estimate (v)** may seem identical. However, when pronounced we can hear the difference immediately. Compare these two sentences:

Our initial **estimate / 'estimat/** turned out to be incorrect.

It is hard to **estimate / estiment/** the costs at the moment.

The change in pronunciation depends on the part of speech, i.e. when it's **a noun** it has the **/'estimat/** pronunciation. But when used as **a verb** we say **/'estiment/**. The same applies to words such as separate or moderate.

DESCRIBING TRENDS

Our business has experienced a very turbulent year indeed - our preliminary estimates proved to be slightly unrealistic, **to put it mildly**. In the first quarter, sales steadily increased to 30,000 units as opposed to the initial 28,000. However, in the following period they **plummeted** to an-all time low as our competitors launched a rival product. **Owing** to our almost immediate reaction in the form of a vigorous advertising campaign, the figures showed signs of **bottoming out** and sales have finally **levelled off** in the third quarter. Probably as a result of the ongoing campaign, the profits surprisingly **soared** in the last accounting unit.
