Make sure means ujistit se. She pops in every morning to make sure that I am alright.
Assure means ujistit někoho. I can assure you of my support.
Reassure means uklidnit. The police reassured me that I had done nothing wrong.

PAYING FOR SOMEBODY IN A RESTAURANT



"**Let me get lunch**" is what you say when you offer to pay the bill for another person. You can also say "**Let me get this**", "I'll get it", "**This is on me**" or "**It's my treat**". Don't use the word "invite", as this is only used for asking someone to come to a party or other event (We invited 150 guests to our company anniversary")
