

SUGGEST



Don't say: I suggest to go to the cinema.

Say: I **suggest going** to the cinema.

I **suggest (that) we go** to the cinema.

I **suggest (that) we should go** to the cinema.

!Suggest can never be followed by an infinitive. All other constructions are possible. The most frequent one is the one with a gerund (-ing form).

REASONS



That's the **reason why** we met.

Do you know the **reason for** their behaviour?

I went there **for health/personal reasons**.

For some reason he did not want to talk to me.

For reasons best known to herself she decided to go abroad.

I **have no reason to** believe him.

I had to go there. I just **had my reasons**.

We **had every reason to** leave the place at once.

The conditions they suggested **go beyond all reason**.

"Why are you here?" "Oh, **no reason**."

reason why/for – důvod pro, příčina k

for health/personal reasons – ze zdravotních/osobních důvodů

for some reason – z nějakého důvodu

for reasons best known to oneself – z důvodů známých jen sobě

have (no) reasons to do sth – (ne)mít důvod něco udělat

have one's reasons – mít své důvody

have every reason to do sth – mít dobrý důvod něco udělat

be/go beyond all reason – přesahovat všechny meze

no reason – hovor. jen tak
