ADJECTIVES ENDING WITH -ED OR -ING



Don't say: The movie was bored which made me very disappointing. **Say**: The movie was **boring**, which made me very **disappointed**.

!When you want to express how you feel as a consequence (dusledkem) of some action you should use the adjectives that have the **-ed** ending. However, when you want to say what something is

like, the **-ing** adjective is used.

ABBREVIATIONS



An **abbreviation** is a shortened form of a word or phrase. Usually, but not always, it **consists of** a letter or group of letters taken from the word or phrase.
