AS or LIKE

Don't say: You don't look **as** your sister.

Say: You don't look **like** your sister.

! **As** is a conjunction (spojka), and is usually followed by a noun or pronoun in the nominative case (1. pád). **Like** isn't a conjunction, but an adjective which acts like a preposition (předložka) followed by a noun in the objective case.

MAKING SUGGESTIONS
