

SALARY x WAGE x PAY

All three words refer to the money you receive for doing your job, however, there are some differences:



Salary - usually associated with professional employees or office jobs, paid monthly at a fixed rate (usually expressed as an annual figure, e.g. in job adverts)

Wage - typically manual or service jobs with a specific rate per hour, usually paid weekly

Pay - the most general word of the three, can be used for any kind of job and doesn't specify when it is paid
