EACH or EVERY

Don't say: She gave a pear to every of the children. Each child had a pear. Say: She gave a pear to **each** of the children. **Every** child had a pear.

! Use **each** for one of two or more things, taken **one by one.** Never use every for two, but always for more than two things **as a group. Each** is more individual and specific, but **every** is used more for emphasis the more emphatic word.

ASKING FOR EXPLANATIONS

Sometimes, things happen that we would like explained and we must demand explanations. There are a number of formulas used when demanding explanations:



- Can you tell me why...
- I don't understand why...
- Can you explain why...
- Why is it that...
- How come...
- Does this mean...
- Do you really expect me to believe...
