

SALE x DISCOUNT

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Don't say: There were big discounts in the shops. **Say**: There were big **sales** in the shops.

A discount is the amount of money that is taken off the usual cost of something, usually expressed in **percent**, e.g. they offer a 5% discount if you pay by credit card.

A sale (countable) is the occasion when a shop sells its goods at a **lower** price than **usual**, e.g. The sales start right after Christmas.
