#### HABIT and CUSTOM

! A **habit** belongs to the individual, but a **custom** belongs to a society.

### SECRET TO A GREAT HANDSHAKE



**1. Start with eye contact and a smile** - a great handshake is about connecting with the other person.

**2. Go for the thumb** - keep your hand open and make sure your handshake will be a hand shake, not a finger or palm shake.

**3. Firm but not strong** – always make your grip firm, but make adjustments based on the firmness of the other person's grip.

**4.** Up and down, not back and forth - a good handshake has a nice up and down motion, not a back and forth one.

5. Adjust duration to the situation – an average handshake lasts about 2 seconds
6. Close with eye contact and a smile – if the smile and eye contact hasn't continued throughout the handshake, finish it off that way.
