IN FRONT OF vs BEFORE

Don't say: "I was standing before the butcher's." **Say**: "I was standing in front of the butcher's."

We use **before** to talk about time, whereas we use **in front of** when we talk about place.

P: Hello Susan, you have so many bags. Where have you been?

S: Well, I did some shopping before I met you.

P: I can see that. Were you at the new **butcher's** on the corner of Regent Street?

S: Yes, there was a long **queue** in front of the store. They have a **wide variety** of meat.

P: Oh, I should go there one day. I prefer shopping in **delicatessen**. They offer various hams, cheese and wines. I highly recommend it. Where else did you go?

S: I needed to buy some rolls and bread, so I started at the **baker's**. Then I went to the **chemist's** to pick up some medicine. There were too many people at the **fishmonger's**, so I **popped into** the butcher's.

P: That sounds like a lot of shopping. I need to

take my clothes and leave them in the **launderette** and **dry cleaner's** tomorrow because I'm going to a wedding at the weekend.

S: Nice! My mother is celebrating her birthday on Friday, so I should go to the **stationer's** and buy her a birthday card. Also, I want to choose a fine ring at the **jeweller's** for her.

P: Oh, say happy birthday to her!

S: I will.
