## **SYMPATHETIC**



**Don't say**: The people in my class are all very *sympathetic*. **Say**: The people in my class are all very *nice/pleasant/easy to get on with.* 

Sympathetic means caring and feeling sorry about someone's problems (a sympathetic friend)! Sympathetic to/towards someone/something.

## **USEFUL PHRASES:**

A: Oh dear – you **look like death warmed up!** Did you have a late night last night?

B: No, not really. But I couldn't sleep. I **didn't sleep a wink** and now I feel exhausted.

A: Oh, it's horrible when that happens.
