safe /se f/ and **dangerous** /de n.d r. s/ are opposite adjectives. We use them to talk about whether a situation or something can cause harm or not.

safety /se f.ti/ and **danger** /de n.d r/ have the same meaning as safe and dangerous but they are nouns.

Even though there have been several **disasters** recently, it is still more **dangerous** to ride a motorbike or drive a car than fly on an airplane.
