

VISIT and ATTEND



Don't say: I visit an international university.

Say: I **attend** an international university.

Don't say: My family attends Paris every year at Christmas.

Say: My family **visits** Paris every year at Christmas.

!We use **attend** in connection with **schools and institutions** and **visit** when we speak with **people or cities and other places**.

The OPEN UNIVERSITY



This is one development in education in which Britain can **claim** to have led the world. It was started in 1969. It **allows** people who do not have the **opportunity** to be an ordinary 'student' **to study for a degree**. Its courses are taught through television, radio and specially-written course books. Its students work with **tutors**, to whom they send their written work and with whom they then discuss it, **either** at a meeting **or** through correspondence. In the summer, they have to attend short **residential** courses of about a week.
