Don't use: The guitar player plays very good.

Say: The guitar player plays very **well**.

! Good is an adjective only, and we can't use it as an adverb.

SAYING 'NO' NICELY

Sometimes you need to say no and of course, saying just 'no' can be rather rude. Here are some of the most common ways to say 'no' nicely - or at least not rudely:



- Would you like to see a film tomorrow? **I'm afraid I can't** go out tomorrow.
 - Why don't we have some Indian food? Sorry, but **I don't particularly like** Indian.
 - How about taking a nice walk? **I'd really rather not** take a walk this evening.
 - Would you like to come to an exhibition with us? Thank you, but **it's not my idea of** a fun afternoon out.
 - Let's go for a drive. Sorry, **I'm not really fond of** driving for the fun of it.
 - Why don't you stay the night? That's very kind of you, **but I really have to** get back to the city.
