

PRESENT PERFECT (FOR vs. SINCE)

Don't say: "I worked in Globus 5 years. I worked there from 2009."

Say: "I have worked in Globus for 5 years. I have worked here since 2009."

We use **for** to talk about a period of time, **since** with the beginning of the period of time. **Present perfect** is used for actions or states which started in the past and are still true.

JOB INTERVIEW P: Patricia

HR: Good afternoon. My name is Susanne Brown and I work as an HR specialist.

P: Good afternoon. I'm Patricia Smith. Nice to meet you.

HR: Nice to meet you. As you know there is a **vacancy** in my department. How long have you worked in our company?

P: I have worked as an Accountant Manager in Globus for 7 years now. **However**, I spent one year on **maternity leave** in 2012. Please tell me a little bit about the position.

HR: Good, that means you have been our employee since 1998. OK, it's a **managerial** position. The employee will have to work closely with the **accounting** department. He/she will also **deal with** customers **on a daily basis**.

P: That sounds interesting!

HR: I'm glad to hear it. What are you looking for in a job?

P: The job should help me grow in my **field** because I am **eager** to learn new things and **handle** various problems.

HR: Excellent! We are looking for such a person. I'll email you soon about the result. Thank you for coming.

P: Thank you for the information and meeting me.
