

TO X FOR

TO x FOR

to and **for** are both prepositions. In general, we use **to** in front of a verb, and **for** in front of a noun.

Reason with a verb: I came **TO** eat

Reason with a noun: I came **FOR** dinner

Here are a few more rules:

To	For
We go TO a destination	Benefits: something is good FOR somebody
We give things TO somebody	Helping: doing something FOR somebody
