

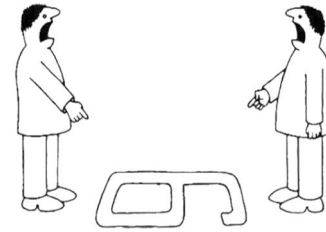

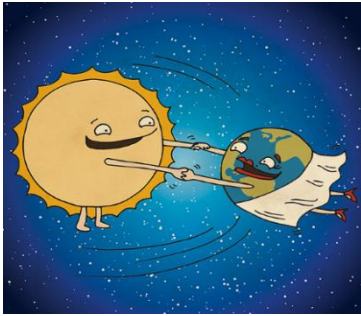
true /tru / is an adjective meaning something is a fact or is real.

THE SUN AND THE EARTH



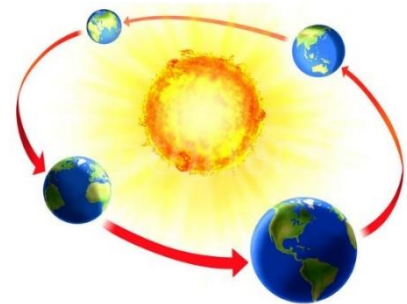

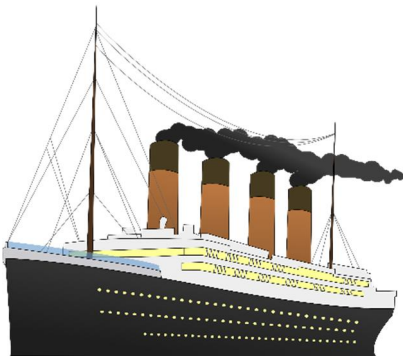
