Don't say: Tom has got any wine. Say: Tom has got **some** wine.

Don't say: There aren't some newspapers on the shelf.

Say: There aren't **any** newspapers on the shelf.

! We use **some** in affirmative sentences (kladné věty) and sometimes in questions Would you like some wine? We use any in negative and question phrases (zápor a otázky).

SOME AND ANY IN EVERYDAY CONVERSATION



Tom: Is there **any** wine left?

Alex: Yes, there is **some** in the bottle on the table.

Tom: Would you like **some** more wine?

Alex: No, thank you. Could I have **some** water, please?

Kate: Do you know **anybody** who comes from Austria?

Petr: Yes, I think there is someone who is from Austria in our

department.

Kate: Great, could you ask him **some** questions for me?

Petr: No problem. Is there anything special you want me to ask? **Kate:** Yes, I have **some** problems with an email from Austria.
