## SOON and EARLY



Don't say: Get well early.

**Say:** Get well **soon**.

Don't say: I usually get up soon and go to bed soon.

**Say:** I usually get up **early** and go to bed **early**.

**!Soon** means 'a short time **after now**' or 'a short time after then'

**Early** means '**near the beginning** of the time/period that we are talking about'.
