WHO x WHICH

Don't say: "This is the manager *which* holds a meeting. "

Say: "This is the manager *who* holds a meeting. "

We use relative pronouns **who** (for people) or **which** (for things) to join sentences to nouns. You can also use **that** instead of **who** or **which**.

COMPANY PARTY (J: John M: Miranda)



J: Hi Miranda, how is it going?

M: I'm doing fine, thank you. Well, as you know, we have a new client, Google,...so our boss wants to **throw a party** for them. Are you in?

J: That sounds great. Where and when does the party take place?

M: On May 14th at 7 o'clock in Noma which is the restaurant located on Strandgade

street. You will need to register with the **hostess** who will stand in the **reception hall** at the entrance.

J: OK. What is the dress code? Shall I wear **fancy-dress**?

M: Yes, I recommend it. Actually, Noma is a **brand-new, fine-dining restaurant** which has been **rated** as one of the best restaurants in the world. You should also remember that when the party is **in full swing**, midnight **entertainers** will come to **cheer us up**!

J: Oh, I am sure we will **have a blast**!
